

Salvador "Rocky Berlanga, 87, entered into eternal rest on March 14, 2014. He was preceded in death by his parents, Esteban and Severlana Berlanga, brothers, Joe, Abel, Gilbert and Sam, and son, Richard. Rocky enlisted in the US Navy at the young age of 16. He was just an 18 year-old sailor when the escort carrier he served on, the USS Gambier Bay, came under intense enemy fire during World Wae II. The ship was sunk on October 25, 1944 in the Battle of Samar. Rocky clung to his life and his shipmates for 72 hours in the harsh Phillippine waters. He survived. During his service, Rocky was awarded several medals including the Purple Heart. Rocky returned to his hometown, San Antonio. There he met the love of his life,

Lupe. They married on May 11, 1946, enjoying 67 years of marriage and raising three children together. Rocky and Lupe travelled the country to attend the USS Gambier Bay Association Survivor Reunions. Rocky was an outdoorsman. He loved being out on the water and deep-sea fishing. Rocky leaves behind his loving wife, Lupe, son Rodger (Ester), daughter Debra (Harold), and sister Toni. He has 7 grandchildren, Steven, Rodger, Noelle, Amanda, Travis, Ricky and Crystal, and 3 great-grandchildren. 



#### Two WWII vets remember Pacific Battle

Years after serving in a World War II assault off the Philippine Islands, two veterans are united in *Port Townsend*.

Fred Grabos, a U.S. Navy turret gunner on the escort carrier USS Gambier Bay, and Ed Adams, a pharmacist's mate on the evacuation transport USS Tryon, both live at the Seaport Landing retirement community on Hancock Street. They both have lived at the home for about two years, but only in the spring of 2011 did they realize their shared involvement in the Battle off Samar in October 1944, in which the 512-foot Gambier Bay was sunk by Japanese forces.

Grabos overheard Adams talking about how he and other *Tryon* crewmembers rescued the carrier's survivors. He realized they had a common thread stretching back 60 years.

"We were kind of connected right then and there," Adams said.

#### **Honoring Veterans**

Several people spoke about the importance of honoring veterans during a presentation at Seaport Landing November 11th.

Also part of the presentation was a 20-minute segment from the NRA-produced "Life of Duty" television series. It features Grabos, Adams and another *Gambier Bay* crewman, Norm St Germain.

Grabos, who flew on a Grumman Avenger torpedo bomber, said in the video, "We got out just in time." He said his plane and others made attack runs on the enemy ships until they got orders to land on a friendly airfield. "We came back to the ship and it was just sitting there, sinking." he said.

Adams, whose ship, the *Tyron*, assisted in recovering the *Gambier Bay's* survivors, said the plight of the crewmembers was deeply affecting. "It just tears your heart out," he said in the video.

Over 68 years later, Grabos and Adams recount some of their stories from the sinking of the *Gambier Bay*. "We saw shells flying into the ship," Grabos said. "We took off. And we were glad to get in the air."

Not so fortunate were the 800 or so men who went into the water when the ship sank. Expecting rescue within hours, instead it took about 44 hours for relief. During that time in the water, sharks got to some men, and drinking salt water got to others.

When ships finally arrived, Adams and other sailors did all they could to help. Adams recalled a man who was so deathly afraid of the sharks he would not get off the plank that had kept him safe.

"So I jumped in the water, swarm a couple strokes," Adams said.

Together with a crewman in the rescue boat, they hoisted the man to safety.

"I was scared as hell." Adams admitted about the shark danger. "I was interested in getting him off (the plank)."
