

Marlene

I am following up on your past requests for information and naval pics for my Dad, Anthony Moffa. I did locate after cleaning out some old files several naval pics of him as well as

telegrams sent to my mom on his missing-in-action status and a followup telegram on his survival. As you recall, I previously forwarded to you his notes on the various battles for the Gambier Bay that I accidentally found. I have attached three scans. The first is a copy of the two telegrams sent to my mom. The first was sent dated Nov 14, 1944 and informs her that Dad was missing in action. Below the first telegram is a second one that was sent to my Mom dated Dec 2, 1944 informing her that Dad had been located and was a survivor. I could never really imagined the emotional highs and lows stemming from the receipt of each telegram. The second scan is of a letter sent to Mom dated Dec 23, 1944 indicating that indeed my Dad was a survivor. And the 3rd scan shows 3 pics of my Dad taken I believe after he went through naval training at the Great Lakes Training facilities. Dad was a Fireman First

Class. Please feel free to use the pics, letter and telegrams as needed. Dad has been gone since 1997 and we indeed greatly miss him.



Fred F. Grabos Sr. 8/1/1921-06/07/2017 AMM 2/c

Fred lived a long and wonderful life. Born and raised in East Chicago, Indiana, it was there that he enlisted at the beginning of WWII. While stationed at Sand Point Naval Air Station in Seattle, prior to being "shipped out", Fred met Helen who would later become his wife. After the Gambier Bay was sunk and while on leave prior to being reassigned to the Fanshaw Bay, Helen took a bus from Seattle to San Diego where Fred and Helen were married.

After the War, Helen and Fred returned to Seattle to raise a family in what Fred always referred to as "God's Country". In the Northwest, with their son and daughter, Helen and Fred enjoyed camping, fishing, gardening, golf and many other activities. Besides their Seattle home, their cabin on the beach on Hoods Canal offered an abundance of seafood, wildlife and other outdoor activities.

Fred's career at the Boeing Company included many highlights. Boeing twice sent him to Japan on special assignment to coordinate tooling for the 767 program. Since the second assignment was to be two years, Helen traveled with Fred. The friends and memories made while in Japan were true treasures. In 1978, Fred was honored by the Boeing Company as the Fabrication Division's Supervisor of the Year. Fred was selected from an "impressive field of candidates representing every organization in the Division. That selection was based on a combination of his fine personal character, professional skill and excellent work performance."

Although Helen, his wife of 53 years, and Fred Jr. have passed, Fred Sr. leaves behind his daughter Jeannette, her husband Brian, a grandson AJ, AJ's wife Rosa and two great grandsons, Hudson and Huxley.

Fred's remains will be laid to rest next to Helen's at Washington Memorial Park in SeaTac, Washington, near Seattle

Oh so many stories to tell about Fred-but we always found time to get ice cream, his favorite. Fred himself was a great story teller-The Midshipmen who met him in San Diego in 2014 can attest to that. Louis "Lou" Rice RdM 3/c

Louis "Lou" William Rice, 93, departed from this earthly life on July 17, 2016. Louis was a WWII Veteran who served in the US Navy from 1941-1945 as a Radarman Third Class on the USS Gambier Bay. He was a member of the Yeatman Lodge #162 F and A M and was the founder and owner of Lou Rice & Associates. Lou is preceded in death by his parents Albert and Ordell Rice, siblings Robert "Bob" Rice, and Jean Houchins. Lou is survived by his wife of 32 years, Toshi: sister, Betty Vanderwalle: children, Joy Marcum, Joseph Rice, Jill DePriest (Steve), Jeri Wood (Jeff), Jeff Rice, and Susan Weber (Ben); grandchildren, Jan Marcum, Jennifer Davis, Matthew Rice (Crystal), Lindsay Hohman (Neil), Luke DePriest, Josh Wood (Jenie), Jayson Wood, Aubrey Webth and Ava Weber; and several great grandchildren. " PEARL HARBOR MISTAKES"

A very different and interesting conclusion of the December 7th attack on Pearl Harbor. Tour boats ferry people out to the USS Arizona Memorial in Hawaii every thirty minutes.

We just missed a ferry and had to wait thirty minutes. I went into a small gift shop to kill time. In the gift shop, I purchased a small book entitled, "Reflections on Pearl Harbor" by Admiral Chester Nimitz.

Sunday, December 7th, 1941--Admiral Chester Nimitz was attending a concert in Washington D.C. He was paged and told there was a phone call for him. When he answered the phone, it was President Franklin Delano Roosevelt. He told Admiral Nimitz that he (Nimitz) would now be the Commander of the Pacific Fleet.

Admiral Nimitz flew to Hawaii to assume command of the Pacific Fleet. He landed at Pearl Harbor on Christmas Eve, 1941. There was such a spirit of despair, dejection and defeat--you would have thought the Japanese had already won the war.

On Christmas Day, 1941, Adm. Nimitz was given a boat tour of the destruction wrought on Pearl Harbor by the Japanese. Big sunken battleships and navy vessels cluttered the waters every where you looked. As the tour boat returned to dock, the young helmsman of the boat asked, "Well Admiral, what do you think after seeing all this destruction?"

Admiral Nimitz's reply shocked everyone within the sound of his voice. Admiral Nimitz said, "The Japanese made three of the biggest mistakes an attack force could ever make, or God was taking care of America . Which do you think it was?"

Shocked and surprised, the young helmsman asked, "What do mean by saying the Japanese made the three biggest mistakes an attack force ever made?" Nimitz explained: "Mistake number one: the Japanese attacked on Sunday morning. Nine out of every ten crewmen of those ships were ashore on leave. If those same ships had been lured to sea and been sunk--we would have lost 38,000 men instead of 3,800."

"Mistake number two: when the Japanese saw all those battleships lined in a row, they got so carried away sinking those battleships, they never once bombed our dry docks opposite those ships. If they had destroyed our dry docks, we would have had to tow everyone of those ships to America to be repaired. As it is now, the ships are in shallow water and can be raised. One tug can pull them over to the dry docks, and we can have them repaired and at sea by the time we could have towed them to America . And I already have crews ashore anxious to man those ships."

"Mistake number three: Every drop of fuel in the Pacific theater of war is on top of the ground in storage tanks five miles away over that hill. One attack plane could have strafed those tanks and destroyed our fuel supply."

"That's why I say the Japanese made three of the biggest mistakes an attack force could make, or God was taking care of America ."

I've never forgotten what I read in that little book. It is still an inspiration as I reflect upon it. Admiral Nimitz was able to see a silver lining in a situation and circumstance where everyone else saw only despair and defeatism. President Roosevelt had chosen the right man for the right job. We desperately needed a leader that could see silver linings in the midst of the clouds of dejection, despair and defeat. There is a reason that our national motto is, "IN GOD WE TRUST."

And it must remain our motto, if we are to be the GREAT nation who returned from the brink of destruction and despair to be the greatest nation on earth which is the land of the free and the home of the brave. "Thanks to the Greatest Generation"
